Purpose

Health care professionals and institutions recognize the current social conflicts regarding immigrants in the United States. Current safety net systems attempt to meet the health care needs of this population, but lack of awareness, coordination and funding make efficient and effective care difficult. This conference will investigate current legal, ethical, and economic aspects of immigration policy, with special attention to rights and duties related to health care issues.

Objectives

Upon completion of this conference, participants should be able to:

- Clarify the rights of immigrants to health care in Colorado.
- Determine the duties of clinicians in providing treatment for immigrants in various therapeutic relationships.
- Provide guidelines for individuals and institutions in developing sustainable safety net systems for immigrant health care.
- Suggest processes that are confidential, respectful and beneficial for patients from immigrant families who seek care at our institutions.
- Review proposed changes in immigration policy to determine the potential impact on the health of immigrants.

Target Audience

This conference will be of interest to those who serve in the health professions or in organizations, institutions, and networks that provide care to immigrant families. This will be an opportunity to deepen understanding of immigration issues and to advance the coordination of community programs.
